A Message from Our ED



YEAR IN REVIEW WITH ERIN PEDEN, EXECUTIVE DIRECTOR

Here at the Community Foundation, 2023 has been a year of both reflection and preparation. As a Community Foundation, we have always been focused on sustainable, long-term giving and growth. But this year we have shifted even more into looking at the ways that we can impact our community long into the future. This work of reflection has us rethinking everything from the ways we grant, to our internal processes and roles, and even down to the way we show up in Central Alberta communities.

This work has been cumbersome and sometimes difficult. But it's also been a revitalizing opportunity to put into practice so many things that we have learned over the last few years from connecting with agencies, listening to our peers, meeting with donors, and sharing with others across the sector. We are eager to put into practice all that we have discovered.



2023 saw the launch of our online scholarship portal, as part of our efforts to streamline Community Foundation processes. With relatively few hiccups, students, counsellors, and even parents rose to the challenge of navigating a new system so that our application process has become simpler for students and for adjudicators tasked with the difficult job of choosing scholarship recipients. This new system was able to facilitate over \$90,000 in financial awards for Central Alberta students in 2023.

Other highlights of 2023 include a Smiles Thru Lindsey initiative to transform mental health protocols in Central Alberta schools, and the creation of the Mothers for Recovery support group, made possible by a Community Foundation grant to Family Services of Central Alberta. Finally, I want to highlight our growth in the form of two new staff members, who you can read about below.

As we look ahead, we have some big announcements planned for 2024, which is also the Foundation's 35th anniversary. We are digging into ways that we can revitalize our work through innovation and changemaking, while we continue to work with donors, agencies, and community members who all share the goal of furthering our mission to strengthen the quality of life in Central Alberta.

Grantmaking in Action



VOLUNTEER CENTRAL GRANT

To celebrate National Volunteer Week, we were pleased to announce the first ever recipients of the new Volunteer Central Legacy Grant. For 2023 there were two grant recipients: the Central Alberta Sexual Assault Support Centre and the Red Deer Public Library.

This grant was awarded to help to support Central Alberta Sexual Assault Support Centre's 24 hour crisis line, and the Red Deer Public Library's Only the Good News project.

Created to carry on the mission of Volunteer Central, the Volunteer Central Legacy Grant supports volunteerism within the charitable sector here in Central Alberta, strengthening community connections and quality of life.



WOMEN & GIRLS GRANT



The Community Foundation was thrilled to announce that the 2023 Women & Girls Grant was awarded to the African Caribbean Centre of Central Alberta, in partnership with Central Alberta Immigrant Women's Association, for their project "Empowering Women & Girls Through Mentorship."

This project aimed to provide women and girls with mentorship, soft skills workshops, and referrals to resources here in our community.

COMMUNITY SERVICES RECOVERY FUNDING

The Red Deer & District Community Foundation was honoured to collaborate with community foundations across Canada, as well as the Canadian Red Cross and the United Way Centraide Canada, as part of the Community Services Recovery Fund.

This funding was provided to Community Service Organizations, including non-profit organizations, Indigenous Governing Bodies or Registered Charities located in Canada.

The Community Foundation was responsible for administering funding through the System and Processes Stream.

INVESTMENT READINESS PROGRAM

This funding from the Government of Canada was designed to support social purpose organizations as they contribute to solving pressing social, cultural and environmental challenges across Canada.

The goal was to help social purpose organizations build their capacity to participate in Canada's growing social finance market and prepare themselves to be able to take on investments. The Investment Readiness Program supports social purpose organizations to build more resilient communities for the future.

Scholarships



SCHOLARSHIP APPLICATIONS MOVED ONLINE FOR 2023 SCHOLARSHIP SEASON

In 2023, the Community Foundation facilitated scholarships to more than 20 students living in Central Alberta, distributing over \$90,000 in total to support students expanding their education into a variety of fields and industries.

The Ford Family Scholarship, targeting students attending Penhold Crossing Secondary School, distributed a record \$30,000 to six students. The William Arthur Bower Memorial Scholarship, in its second year, distributed \$25,000 to five students from Red Deer high schools.

With the addition of a new online application portal this year, the Community Foundation has made applying for scholarships even easier for students.

"One of our goals has been to increase accessibility and ease for students," said Krista Nymark VandenBrink, RDDCF Board Chair. "We recognize the importance of scholarships as the rising cost of post-secondary education continues to be a barrier for students. The online portal streamlines applications for students looking for financial support."

With the addition of more scholarships this year, the Community Foundation now offers 12 different scholarships, to support students in a wide variety of fields.

Building Resilience



SMILES THRU LINDSEY

Smiles Thru Lindsey, a fund held at the Red Deer & District Community Foundation, has distributed \$20,000 to Chinook's Edge School Division and Red Deer Catholic Regional Schools for the development of two protocols to support students who are struggling with self-injury and suicidal ideation. This donation will help to train staff in identifying signs and symptoms of non-suicidal self-injury and suicidal ideation, as well as consistent response protocols.



"Our goal is to ensure staff have the resources and procedures in place to ensure support for youth who are self-harming or have suicide ideation," said Marcie Perdue, Associate Superintendent, Chinook's Edge. "We are excited to work collaboratively with Red Deer Catholic to make a significant impact for students," Perdue continued.

Smiles Thru Lindsey was started by Rick and Cindy More, in honour of their daughter, Lindsey, who died by suicide nearly 8 years ago. Since its inception, Smiles Thru Lindsey has contributed over \$100,000 to mental health initiatives for youth in Central Alberta. The More Family are dedicated to spreading awareness about mental health, and supporting services and programs needed to create change, creating a beautiful legacy of hope.

"When Chinook's Edge and Red Deer Catholic first approached us with this idea, Rick couldn't stop smiling," said Cindy More. Rick More said, "Teachers have so much of an impact with kids. It's possible students will first confide in a teacher before they talk with their parents about their concerns in this area. Also, teachers experience pressure with everything that is expected of them in their work. We are excited about this project because we can see it making a difference."

The hope with this initiative is that the development and implementation of these protocols will create a culture of knowledge and understanding that will decrease risk to students.

MOTHERS FOR RECOVERY

A \$30,000 community grant went to to Family Services of Central Alberta (FSCA) for the creation of a new support group for mothers living with substance use disorder. This initiative seeks to provide mothers with the support they need to overcome addiction while also ensuring that childcare needs are met during programming.



Mothers for Recovery provides an opportunity for mothers who are seeking or maintaining recovery from substance use to receive non-judgmental support in a safe and confidential space. The program involves weekly meetings co-facilitated by a social worker and a mother in recovery herself, modeled after the idea that the best teachers for mothers with addiction are individuals who have recovered from addiction themselves. The program encourages mothers to share their experiences, strengths, and hopes in recovery while amongst peers with similar past and present experiences.

"Our adjudication committee recognized that mothers with substance use disorder face unique challenges, including stigma and shame," said Erin Peden, RDDCF Executive Director. "The Mothers for Recovery program makes sense as an evidence-based early intervention strategy to support not only mothers, but also their children."

To reduce barriers to attendance, young children can participate in the Mothers for Recovery Child Development program which is designed to provide a nurturing environment for children while their mothers attend the support group sessions.

"This concept grew from the lack of addiction services available for women that they could bring their children to and that also dealt with the sensitive parenting issues that accompany substance use disorder," said Judy Scott, FSCA Executive Director. "We want to make it as easy as possible for mothers to attend our meetings and get the support they need, without the barrier of finding reliable childcare."
